

How the Underlying Technology of Bitcoin is Changing Money, Business and the World





Don Tapscott is one of the world's leading authorities on innovation, media, and the economic and social impact of technology and advises business and government leaders around the world. A New York Times best selling author, he has written 15 widely read books and defined many of the key concepts of the digital age. His upcoming book, co-authored by Alex Tapscott (May 2016) is titled BLOCKCHAIN REVOLUTION and is the first important work to explain why blockchain technology can fundamentally change the Internet, what it does, how we use it and both the promise and peril for our civilization.




# SPEAKER: DR. ARVIND KRISHNA

# HOW BLOCKCHAIN FREES THE ENTERPRISE

Dr. Arvind Krishna oversees IBM's Blockchain initiatives, which includes the recent proposal of nearly 44,000 lines of code to the Linux Foundation's Hyperledger Project. IBM Blockchain code is designed to help developers easily build secure distributed ledgers that can be used to exchange most anything of value. IBM recently announced new cloud-based blockchain services for developers, new garages in New York, Tokyo, Singapore and London that will focus on blockchain and a range of added consulting services to rapidly advance the use of distributed ledger technology across multiple industries.





In addition, Krishna helps guide IBM Research's overall technical strategy, oversees a global organization of approximately 3,000 scientists and technologists located at 12 labs on six continents. He is the recipient of a distinguished alumni award from the University of Illinois, is the co-author of 15 patents, has been the editor of IEEE and ACM journals, and has published extensively in technical conferences and journals.


